This year we are encouraging touring cars to enter, but at the same time we wish to maintain our strong support of sports and racing cars in regularity events at Sandown. Period replicas will be assessed for acceptance on an individual basis. The order of the program will place the two divisions early in the running order. Entries for divisional allocation will be made on the driver/car potential so as to ensure maximum safety for all competitors.

The committee will provide a regularity team's prize for first, second, and third placed teams, based on the aggregated points for each team, retained at the conclusion of all events held over the meeting. A team will consist of three drivers, all in one division or two in one division and one in the other division. I encourage competitors to make up teams and take up the challenge.

Entries have been returned earlier than in past years, so I urge you not to delay in getting your entry in as soon as possible so you won't miss out. Sandown 2008 is shaping up to be the best ever.

Tim Blanchard's Website says: June 27, 2008

The last few weeks have been quite busy... Firstly we raced at Rockingham which has a very different feel to it compared to other tracks here in the UK. I think this is mainly due to the fact Rockingham is actually an oval with a race track on the inside and also because it is a fairly new track, it doesn't have the history behind it other tracks have. In saying this however I quite enjoy driving there and since racing there it has become one of my favourite tracks over here...While in Rockingham we finally managed to break through for another win in some very difficult conditions. There had been steady rain since we turned up to the track and by the time we lined up for race one, parts of the track were actually flooded. The last chicane was so deep in water that even without any other cars around the spray off your own front wheels was that bad we could not see where we were going. I have raced many times in the wet but this was something else! We managed to finish the weekend with another two podiums and a new lap record once the track had dried out!

Snetterton was next on the agenda but for a weekend that promised so much it delivered very little. We had been fairly strong in testing there and managed to qualify on the front row but unfortunately a disappointing race in race 1 left us 5th. With Race 2 being the first race we had in warm weather all year it became slightly more difficult to set the cars up, unfortunately the car was quick early in the race which meant we struggled in the later stages and were not able to hold off Getem's Chris Maliepaard finishing the race once again on the podium in 3rd.

I have just returned from Belgium where we were able to race on one of the best race tracks in world Spa Francorchamps! The long straights made for some great racing especially in race 2 with Nick Tandy and Wayne Boyd and I fighting for the lead... Eau Rouge needs no explanation; basically you just need to be really committed.

The best corner I thought however was Blancimont on the back straight just before the bus stop. You approach the corner at around 150mph, have a small lift on turn in then get back into the throttle with the car in a full slide. As the race goes on and your tyres get older it becomes tougher and tougher as you are starting to use more and more of the track. The results weren't too bad 2nd in Race 1 and after an incident late in Race 2 we managed to recover for 4th.

My family has arrived in Europe on holiday just in time for Spa and I managed to go to Paris for a few days with them which was great fun. Unfortunately I had to return early to the UK to test at Brands Hatch tomorrow but was still able to visit many of Paris' main tourist attractions.

Next Monday is my 21st birthday (yes I am getting old; better win some more races before I pass my use by date!!!). For my birthday I will be travelling through Belgium, Holland and Spain with some school friends that are also in Europe at the moment...Anyway I better get some sleep, got to find a few tenths tomorrow as we weren't too good at Brands earlier this year!!

3rd generation driver Matthew Brabham overcame a strong field of 47 karters from all across Australia to win the Junior National Light State title in a dominating display atthe Queensland State Titles held in Rockhampton. After qualifying on the front row Matthew driving the DP Karts/Adam Macrow Racing Arrow, won the three heat races to decide the grid for the final with ease.

The 19 lap final started in exciting fashion with the usual frantic push and shove racing that Junior National Light is famous for but after a few laps Brabham was able to pull clear for the win. This win is Matthew's third State Title.

Matthew also was fastest in qualifying for the Junior Clubman race and came home In a very competitive 4th place to complete a very successful State Championship for the young 14 year old racer. It was one of those weekends that comes along very rarely when everything goes right from start to finish. "The Kart was awesome all week and a big thank you to DP Karts, Adam Macrow and my Dad for all the help.
