## A curious anomaly


Fifth category rules for production sports cars in the CAMS manual allow for "continuation models" and the Datsun 240Z's successor, the 260Z, is given as an example. Hence I was a little confused when the entry in Regularity of my Porsche 944S2 at Sandown was rejected. Obviously the car had been manufactured after the 1977 cut-off date but it is definitely a "continuation" of the mid-seventies Porsche 924 design. (A further curiosity is that the car had been accepted for the 2014 events at Phillip Island and Sandown).

Anyway I decided to take it no further as I respect the club's decisions and could hardly argue against a strict interpretation of historic rules in Australia, having written an article on this topic for this Newsletter, which received favourable comment.

Hence members might understand my surprise when I visited Sandown as a spectator to find two "replicas"- and I use the term loosely - had been allowed to start in Regularity. First, a very pretty approximation of a fifties Porsche 550 Spyder

which, unlike an original Spyder, had a plastic body and - wait for it - a modern Subaru engine! The other car was loosely based on a mid-sixties Shelby Daytona. Again it looked quite nice but was plastic bodied (unlike the original) and had a modern EFI engine and running gear. I would be happy to own either car, but historic they ain't! Regs for the upcoming Philip Island historics are vague when it comes to the Regularity event. It would be helpful if the VHRR could clarify once and for all exactly what type of car it will allow in this category at the Island and at future historic meetings. Richard Batchelor
